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Message from the Founders

Don't ever believe that "family" is not important. The identity and the inner strength of each one of us comes from our birth family and God Himself. Help One Child is determined to do all we can - with your support and the help of churches, to strengthen struggling families so that painful disruptions can be avoided. Through CarePortal: social workers, teachers, and members of the community are making known critical family needs making it possible for HOC to connect them with churches who are eager to provide. Some birth families have never experienced this kind of love.

The Covid 19 pandemic has created fears and difficulties for all families, but the patience of foster families has really been stretched thin. Many children have been unable to see their biological parents. They have lost old friends with no opportunity to make new ones. They were already behind at school and now they are further behind. Many parents have had to balance working at home with the added responsibility of monitoring the children's schooling. It's just too much!

But God is good! The staff at HOC, led by Valerie Crane, is young, speedy, technically savvy, and full of energy and optimism. They have found many new ways to reach the families of our community with support and parenting education, while expanding services to new counties around the Bay Area.

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
Beating the ODDS


370 Kids Served208 Requests Met35 Participating Churches

Children placed with a relative (or known individual i.e., godparent) have statistically lower rates of changes in placement than children in other settings. Often, these family members aren't prepared to take additional children into their care and can greatly benefit from the provision of physical items such as bunk beds, car seats, etc.

We never really thought about foster care, but somehow we always had extra kids living with us. Kayla came to us when she was 17. She had been in a group home, and all she wanted was a 'real family'.

Years later, after a failed marriage and a custody loss, Kayla's life went down hill and she started using drugs again. Once a year or so, she would call and say she was finished with that life, but then she would never call again.

Finally, last August, she called and said she was pregnant and wanted to leave the life she was leading. Around the time her baby was coming, she called more often and more frantically. After the baby was born, she realized it was drugs or the baby and she chose her daughter.

After 6 months in a rehab facility in San Jose for mothers with their children, Kayla returned home to us with her daughter. I reached out to Help One Child immediately. They had supported us all those year before when Kayla was a teenager. They once again, were joining us in prayer and providing much needed encouragement. We were, and still are, unsure of how this will all turn out. Kayla has a long way to go and so do we. Having them with us has brought new life to old bones.

Through this journey we experienced love growing in our hearts that we would never have experienced in any other way. There were many ups, downs, conflicts, problems, pain and joy but also some hilarious stories to tell.






